Those not literate in languages, science, music or other specialised fields, cannot hope to read the signs of that field. They cannot identify warnings and they cannot see opportunities. They miss out entirely on the beauty, hope, insight or wisdom of worlds where they cannot communicate.

Unfortunately most people cannot read the future. They cannot understand the impact of trends or fads. They cannot scan for changes on the horizon. They have little appreciation of the value of time and different time horizons. And they have no model to make sense of what is coming or how to prepare for it.
